Jay C. Farrar is manager of government affairs, and the Washington, D.C. office. He was elected principle vice president in 2011.

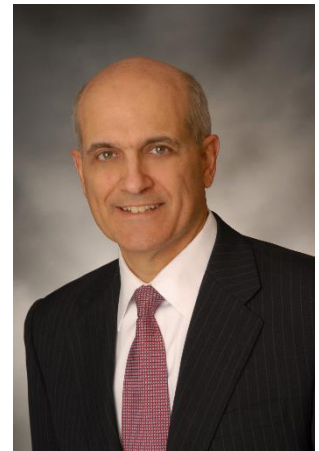
Jay creates and participates in strategic advocacy at the Federal level, and represents Bechtel in political and policy matters.
